Eastern Washington University and the WSU Spokane County 4-H won a No Child Left Inside Grant to support a 2009 Summer Science Camp. This year they will offer two, one-week (5-day) residential science camps. They will be held at the Chewelah Peaks learning Center. Topics will be forestry, water quality, weed science and geology. The camps emphasize observation and process skills, inquiry, personal health and 4-H style challenge activities (they have a full high and low challenge course available at the camp). The first week, July 21-24, is designed for youth aged 10-12 years old and the second week, July 27-August 1, for ages 13-15. The cost is \$50.00/camper and is open to all youth. In 1966, the Powers Sunshine Girl's 4-H Club from Metropolis, Illinois published a cookbook (anybody up for this fundraising opportunity - check into it ??) Here's a nice refreshing fruit salad recipe to try -

Tropicana Salad

1 c. pineapple tidbits or fresh cut
1/4 c. coarsely chopped nuts
5 cut up maraschino cherries
5 cut up pitted dates
1 pt. cottage cheese
4 bananas
Lettuce leaves

Mix all ingredients, except the banana, in a bowl, cover and chill in the refrigerator. To serve, peel bananas and split lengthwise. Arrange lettuce leaves on individual salad plates, top with banana and a generous amount of the cottage cheese mixture, then garnish with a cherry.
